Overview:

Better Future Project (BFP) is looking for an experienced, strategic, and collaborative Harvard Organizer to join our Divest Ed team and support the Divest Harvard divestment movement! The Harvard Organizer provides strategic and coaching support to the student-led campaign for climate justice at Harvard College, including a strong focus on alumni outreach and engagement. They will also work with the Divest Ed team to coordinate our national network, our digital training calls, and our Fellowship, which is a digital and in-person organizing training and leadership development program for college students (including key leaders from Divest Harvard). This is a full-time permanent position.

Key Responsibilities:

- Support Divest Harvard students to develop strategy, build student power, conduct negotiations, earn media attention, and develop organizing skills.
- Lead Divest Harvard alumni engagement, including setting up DH alumni organizing hubs, targeting high-profile Harvard alumni for support, increasing Harvard alumni petition signatures, and planning actions and engagements around reunions and other alumni events.
- Help coordinate the Fellowship by planning and leading organizing training webinars.
- Assist in the design, recruitment for, and implementation of a summer fellowship program for 2019 that would provide the opportunity for 15-30 student leaders to grow their organizing skills, while connecting with and supporting the broader climate justice movement.

Required Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent experience
- 2+ years of campus campaigning or organizing experience
- Familiarity with divestment
- Demonstrated interest in climate, environmental, and/or social justice
- Experience leading and designing trainings (can include any of the following topics: organizing skills, organizing theory, climate justice, anti-oppression, leadership development, action planning)
- Comfort working with undergraduate college students in on-campus settings
- Familiarity with and passion for building an intersectional movement and learning about anti-oppression and social justice issues
- Familiarity with movement-building and organizing theory
- Competency with social media platforms (Twitter, Facebook, Instagram)

An ideal candidate would also possess:

- Experience working in or with other social movements, such as immigration justice, racial justice, student debt, labor and worker justice, education reform, etc.
- Experience with NationBuilder or other database software
- Experience with negotiation theories and practice
